- Picket Captains also oversee the attendance sheet on the front line so that our members can receive their strike pay
- That all strike activities are shared fairly amongst our members
- Picket Captains also help to ensure the safety of our members
- Picket Captains help ensure members of the Depot unit (s) of their role as picketers on the front line

As with any Lock-outs, Walk-outs, demonstrations and/or Strike activities, the employer, Canada Post will be watching closely by their members. but not limited to Supervisors, Corporate security and media.

As with our rallying picketers, our Picket Captains participate in our collective voice and strong support for our National CUPW negotiators during our Program of Demands – Negotiations 2018 with Canada Post. It is our intention to to achieve a new set of Collective Agreements that reflects the needed workforce equality and workforce improvements.
